Mass Attendance Protocols

Attendance at the weekend Masses is increasing, which is wonderful!

Some restrictions regarding attendance at Mass are being modified.

The Saturday 5:00 p.m. Mass & Sunday 8:00 a.m. Mass, will remain the same with the practice of social distancing (seating in every other pew), and the practice of wearing of masks being required.

At the Sunday 10:30 a.m. Mass the ropes closing off pews will be removed allowing seating in every pew, and **masks are encouraged but not required.**

You are still asked to sign in and use hand sanitizer when entering and leaving the church.

Pews will be sanitized between the Masses.

At this time music will still be provided at some of the Masses, but in a very minimal manner. Please feel free to join Father in reciting the Entrance and Communion Antiphons, when there is no music at those times.

Training and Commissioning of Lectors and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC) ~ November 15th

Please plan to attend a training for all Lectors and EMHC's in order to refresh and learn some of the various elements and actions of serving effectively in a given ministry.

The training and commissioning will occur **from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. in the church.** The end of the session will involve being commissioned for the ministry in our parish for a period of three (3) years. Fr. Bruce will be conducting the training session. If you are interested in serving in this ministry, but never have before, you are most welcome to attend as well to be trained!

If you would like Holy Water for your homes, please bring a container of water to Mass with your name on it and set it on the table in the entry to the Church. Father Bruce will bless the water before Mass, so that you can take it with you as you leave the church after Mass.

Honoring and Emulating All the Saints

Looking to the saints reminds us that we are part of a bigger story.

The sacrifices and struggles we go through here on earth to be faithful to Christ and the Church are worth it.

We need this reminder. We need it more than once a year. And the Church gives it to us more than once a year - we celebrate saints' days all throughout the liturgical calendar.

But All Saints' Day reminds us of something that can get lost in the other saints' days.

The most famous saints often led such extraordinary lives that it's hard for us to emulate them.

It's easy to honor them, recognizing all that they did for Christ, and all that Christ did for them.

But honoring the saints is not enough.

We also need to emulate them. And this is where All Saints' Day comes in.

Today we honor all of saintly men and women who have not been canonized by the Church, who are not famous saints, but who have nevertheless followed Christ heroically and taken their place in heaven.

These are the saints that lived ordinary lives on the outside, and extraordinary lives on the inside.

And God didn't overlook them.

And there is no shortage of them. They make up a "great multitude, which no one could count," as St. John puts it in the First Reading.

Most of us live ordinary lives on the outside.

And maybe some of us, because of that, think that we can't really live up to the high standard set by the famous saints who did miracles and lived dramatic lives.

But today's Solemnity assures us that we can.

It assures us that if we live each day as Christ would have us, striving to do God's will with all our strength and to love our neighbor as ourselves, then our lives, which look so ordinary on the outside, will be truly extraordinary on the inside.

Today we will receive Christ once again in the Eucharist, which has been the food of all the saints.

If He is giving Himself to us, it's only because He knows that with His help, we too can experience how blessed it is to be faithful children of God.
